Mr. Barton of Texas (for himself, Mr. Brady, and Mr. Hall of Texas) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Commerce

A BILL

To monitor and analyze energy use, and conduct continuous commissioning in Federal buildings to optimize building energy systems.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Energy Mon-
- 5 itoring, Commissioning, and Savings Act of 1997".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds that—
- 8 (1) large buildings use more than 30 percent of
- 9 the Nation's total energy resources;

- 1 (2) many large buildings are inefficient because 2 of poor design and operation; 3 (3) energy expenditures in most buildings may 4 be reduced by 10–40 percent by implementing more 5 efficient system operating practices; and 6 (4) practical methods must be developed to re-
- duce unnecessary energy use in Federal buildings.

8 SEC. 3. GRANT AUTHORIZED.

- 9 The Secretary of Energy is authorized to award ex-
- 10 tramural funds to monitor and analyze energy use, and
- 11 to conduct continuous commissioning in Federal buildings
- 12 to optimize building energy systems.

13 SEC. 4. CONDITIONS OF GRANT.

- To receive funds under this Act, an entity shall sub-
- 15 mit an application to the Secretary of Energy in such form
- 16 and containing such information as the Secretary may re-
- 17 quire.

18 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- 19 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums as
- 20 may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act.
