A BILL

To terminate the property disposition program of the Department of Housing and Urban Development providing single family properties for use for the homeless.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CONGRESSIONAL FINDINGS.
- 4 The Congress finds that—
- 5 (1) while there is a pressing need to serve
- 6 homeless families and individuals, the program of
- 7 the Department of Housing and Urban Development
- 8 for disposition of single family properties for use by
- 9 the homeless is ineffective;

1	(2) Federal housing programs for the homeless
2	must serve homeless families and individuals at a
3	reasonable cost to taxpayers; and

(3) the single family property disposition program for the homeless is poorly designed and administered, drains critical human and financial resources from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, is fraught with abuse and fraud, and, therefore, is a poor use of taxpayer assets.

The program for disposition of single family properties acquired by the Department of Housing and Urban Development for use by the homeless under subpart E of part 291 of title 24, Code of Federal Regulations is hereby terminated and no properties may be disposed of under such program. The provisions of such subpart shall have no force or effect.
