A BILL

To provide for the comparable treatment of Federal employees and Members of Congress and the President during a period in which there is a Federal Government shutdown.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PAY OF MEMBERS OF CONGRESS AND THE
- 4 PRESIDENT DURING GOVERNMENT SHUT-
- 5 DOWNS.
- 6 (a) Comparable Pay Treatment for Members
- 7 of Congress.—The basic pay of Members of Congress

- 1 shall be treated in the same manner as the basic pay of
- 2 the most adversely affected Federal employees who are not
- 3 compensated for any period in which—
- 4 (1) there is more than a 24-hour lapse in ap-
- 5 propriations for any Federal agency or department
- 6 as a result of a failure to enact a regular appropria-
- 7 tions bill or continuing resolution; or
- 8 (2) the Federal Government is unable to make
- 9 payments or meet obligations because the public
- debt limit under section 3101 of title 31, United
- 11 States Code, has been reached.
- 12 (b) Authority To Promulgate Regulations.—
- 13 The Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Administrative
- 14 Officer of the House of Representatives shall promulgate
- 15 any regulations needed to implement this section in a
- 16 manner consistent with the Constitution of the United
- 17 States.
- 18 (c) Comparable Pay Treatment for the Presi-
- 19 DENT OF THE UNITED STATES.—The basic pay of the
- 20 President of the United States shall be treated in the same
- 21 manner as the pay of Members of Congress described in
- 22 subsection (a).

- 1 (d) SEVERABILITY.—If any provision of this section
- 2 is held invalid by any Federal court, the remaining provi-

3 sions shall remain valid.
