- 7 ZENS.—Section 319(b)(2) of the Federal Election Cam-
- 8 paign Act of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 441e(b)(2)) is amended by

- 1 striking "and who is not lawfully admitted" and all that
- 2 follows and inserting a period.
- 3 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 4 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to contributions or
- 5 expenditures made on or after the date of the enactment
