A BILL

To prohibit United States citizens from traveling into or through a country or area for which a United States passport is invalid.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON TRAVEL TO OR THROUGH
- 4 CERTAIN COUNTRIES.
- 5 (a) Prohibition.—Except as provided in subsection
- 6 (b), in a case in which the Secretary of State has declared
- 7 United States passports invalid, under the Act of July 3,
- 8 1926 (22 U.S.C. 211a), for travel into or through a coun-
- 9 try or area, any person owing allegiance to the United
- 10 States who travels into or through such country or area,

- 1 knowing that such passports are invalid for such travel,
- 2 shall be imprisoned not more than 10 years (in the case
- 3 of the first or second offense), or 15 years (in the case
- 4 of any other offense), fined under title 18, United States
- 5 Code, or both.
- 6 (b) Exception.—Subsection (a) does not apply to
- 7 travel by a person whose passport has been specifically
- 8 validated for such travel by the United States Govern-
- 9 ment.
