- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "50 States Commemo-
- 5 rative Coin Program Amendments Act of 1998".

- 3 (1) The 50 States Commemorative Coin Pro-4 gram Act established a 10-year program for com-5 memorating each of the 50 States through designs 6 on circulating quarter dollars issued during the ef-7 fective period of the program.
- 8 (2) The District of Columbia, American Samoa, 9 Guam, Puerto Rico, and the United States Virgin Islands are part of the United States and it is im-10 11 portant that the youth of the United States, a large 12 number of whom are expected to collect complete 13 sets of the quarter dollars issued during the pro-14 gram, learn about their national history, geography, 15 and heritage through the program.

11	paragraph in the same manner such paragraphs
12	apply to quarter dollars issued in accordance
13	with paragraph (1).

American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, or the
United States Virgin Islands becomes a State
before the end of the 10-year period referred to
in paragraph (1), subparagraph (B) shall apply
and subparagraph (C) shall not apply with respect to such State.".
