Mrs. MORELLA (for herself and Ms. STABENOW) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

A BILL

To amend the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act to reauthorize the national toll-free telephone domestic violence hotline.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. NATIONAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE HOTLINE RE-**
4 **AUTHORIZATION.**

5 Section 316(f)(1) of the Family Violence Prevention
6 and Services Act (42 U.S.C. 10416(f)(1)) is amended to
7 read as follows:

8 “(1) IN GENERAL.—There are authorized to be
9 appropriated to carry out the purposes of this sec-
10 tion—

1 “(A) \$1,600,000 for fiscal year 1999;
2 “(B) \$1,800,000 for fiscal year 2000;
3 “(C) \$2,000,000 for fiscal year 2001;
4 “(D) \$2,000,000 for fiscal year 2002; and
5 “(E) \$2,000,000 for fiscal year 2003.”.

6 **SEC. 2. TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS.**

7 Section 316 of the Family Violence Prevention and
8 Services Act (42 U.S.C. 10416) is amended by redesignat-
9 ing subsection (f) (as amended by section 1) as subsection
10 (g) and by inserting after subsection (e) the following:

11 “(f) Within 90 days after the date of the enactment
12 of this subsection, any entity receiving a grant under sub-
13 section (a) shall prepare and submit a report to the Sec-
14 retary that evaluates the effectiveness of the use of
15 amounts received under such grant by such grantee and
16 containing such other information as the Secretary may
17 prescribe. The Secretary shall publish any such report and
18 provide at least 90 days for notice and opportunity for
19 public comment before awarding or renewing any such
20 grant.”.

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
