A BILL

To require the Federal Communications Commission to prescribe rules to protect public safety by preventing broadcasts that create hazards for motorists.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 The Congress finds that—
- 5 (1) the Federal Government has an obligation
- 6 to protect the health and safety of United States
- 7 citizens;
- 8 (2) motor vehicle operators, when distracted,
- 9 can pose a safety risk to others on the roads; and

1 (3) radio broadcasts that employ sound effects 2 identical or substantially similar to customary public 3 safety or traffic sounds, such as horns, sirens, or 4 train whistles, can be distracting and hazardous to 5 motor vehicle operators.

6 SEC. 2. RULES REQUIRED.

The Federal Communications Commission shall es-8 tablish rules barring the use of horns, sirens, or other cus-9 tomary public safety or traffic sounds from audio broad-10 casts as necessary to prevent such sounds effects from ad-11 versely affecting the public safety of motor vehicle opera-12 tors, passengers, or pedestrians.
