A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to revise the filing deadline for certain claims under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Vaccine Injury
- 5 Compensation Reform Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to prevent the unfair denial
- 8 of compensation under the National Vaccine Injury Com-
- 9 pensation Program to certain individuals who are diag-
- 10 nosed as having vaccine-related injuries more than 36

months after the first symptom, manifestation of onset,
or significant aggravation of such injuries.
SEC. 3. REVISION OF FILING DEADLINE FOR CERTAIN
CLAIMS UNDER NATIONAL VACCINE INJURY
COMPENSATION PROGRAM.
Paragraph (2) of section 2116(a) of the Public
Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300aa–16(a)) is amended
by striking "no petition" and all that follows in such para-
graph and inserting the following: "no petition may be
filed for compensation under the Program for such injury
after the expiration of 36 months after the date on which
such injury is diagnosed, except that, if such injury is first
diagnosed before the date of the enactment of the Vaccine
Injury Compensation Reform Act, no petition may be filed
for compensation under the Program for such injury after
the expiration of 36 months after the latest of—
"(A) the date on which such injury is diag-
nosed,
"(B) the date of the occurrence of the first
symptom or manifestation of onset or of the
significant aggravation of such injury, or
"(C) the date of the enactment of the Vac-
cine Injury Compensation Reform Act, if such
injury is first diagnosed after the expiration of
