## A BILL

To provide reporting requirements for the assertion of executive privilege, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Executive Privilege
- 5 Notification Act of 1998".
- 6 SEC. 2. REPORTING REQUIREMENT.
- 7 (a) Initial Report.—Whenever the President as-
- 8 serts executive privilege in any forum, the President shall
- 9 promptly report the assertion to the Speaker of the House
- 10 and House minority leader, and the Senate majority and

- 1 Senate minority leaders. The report shall state the date
- 2 of the assertion, the documents, testimony or other infor-
- 3 mation covered by the assertion, and the legal basis for
- 4 the assertion. The report shall also contain any written
- 5 legal opinion by the Attorney General regarding the law-
- 6 fulness of the assertion.
- 7 (b) Report by Presiding Judge.—Whenever, in a
- 8 judicial action or proceeding, the President asserts execu-
- 9 tive privilege, it shall be the duty of the presiding judicial
- 10 officer in that action or proceeding promptly to report the
- 11 assertion to the Speaker of the House and House minority
- 12 leader, and the Senate majority and minority leaders. This
- 13 obligation is independent of the reporting obligation set
- 14 forth in subsection (a).
- 15 (c) Amicus Briefs.—Any Member of either House
- 16 of Congress shall have the right to file an amicus brief,
- 17 regarding any assertion of executive privilege by the Presi-
- 18 dent, in any judicial action or proceeding in which that
- 19 assertion is made.
- 20 (d) Presidential Protection Privilege.—No
- 21 person may, in connection with any Federal criminal in-
- 22 vestigation, assert a testimonial privilege alleged to arise
- 23 out of the function of protecting the President.
