Mr. RYUN (for himself, Mr. STUMP, Mr. SAXTON, Mr. TIAHRT, Mr. DICKEY, Mr. SNOWBARGER, Mr. WAMP, and Ms. DANNER) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations

A BILL

To prohibit the export of missile equipment and technology to the People's Republic of China.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON EXPORTS OF MISSILE EQUIP
MENT AND TECHNOLOGY TO CHINA.

(a) PROHIBITION.—No missile equipment or technology may be exported to the People's Republic of China.

(b) TERMINATION OF PROHIBITION.—The prohibition established in subsection (a) shall terminate when—

Missile Technology Control Regime;

(1) the People's Republic of China joins the

- (2) the People's Republic of China guarantees that it does not and will not transfer missile equipment or technology to Iran, Pakistan, or any nation that has not joined the Missile Technology Control Regime; and
 - (3) the President certifies to the Congress that no such transfer is occurring or is likely to occur.
 - (b) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this Act—
 - (1) the term "missile equipment or technology" means those items listed in category I or category II of the Missile Technology Control Regime Annex;
 - (2) the term "Missile Technology Control Regime" means the policy statement, between the United States, the United Kingdom, the Federal Republic of Germany, France, Italy, Canada, and Japan, announced April 16, 1987, to restrict sensitive missile-relevant transfers based on the Missile Technology Control Regime Annex, and any amendments thereto; and
 - (3) the term "Missile Technology Control Regime Annex" means the Guidelines and Equipment and Technology Annex of the Missile Technology Control Regime, and any amendments thereto.
