A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration to address the aircraft noise problems of Queens and Long Island, New York.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Queens and Long Is-
- 5 land Aircraft Noise Correction Act of 1998".

1 SEC. 2. REDUCTION IN AIRCRAFT NOISE OVER QUEENS

- 2 AND LONG ISLAND, NEW YORK.
- 3 (a) Comprehensive Plan.—Not later than 6
- 4 months after the date of enactment of this Act, the Ad-
- 5 ministrator of the Federal Aviation Administration shall
- 6 develop and publish a comprehensive plan to reduce air-
- 7 craft generated noise in Queens and Long Island, New
- 8 York, without compromising safety.
- 9 (b) Requirement.—The plan shall include assur-
- 10 ances that any diversion of air traffic from New Jersey
- 11 will not result in an increase in aircraft generated noise
- 12 in Queens or Long Island, New York.
- (c) Implementation.—The Administrator shall
- 14 begin implementation of the plan on or before the 90th
- 15 day after the date of publication of the plan.
