A BILL

To provide grants to States to offset costs associated with the Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children and Sexually Violent Offender Registration Act.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Megan's Law Imple-
- 5 mentation Act".

1	SEC. 2. GRANTS TO STATES TO OFFSET COSTS ASSOCIATED
2	WITH THE JACOB WETTERLING CRIMES
3	AGAINST CHILDREN AND SEXUALLY VIOLENT
4	OFFENDER REGISTRATION ACT.
5	(a) In General.—Section 170101 of the Violent
6	Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 (42
7	U.S.C. 14071) is amended by—
8	(1) redesignating the second subsection (g) as
9	subsection (h); and
10	(2) adding at the end the following new sub-
11	section:
12	"(i) Grants to States To Comply With the
13	Wetterling Act.—
14	"(1) Program authorized.—
15	"(i) In general.—The Director of the
16	Bureau of Justice Assistance shall award a
17	grant to each eligible State to offset costs di-
18	rectly associated with complying with the Jacob
19	Wetterling Crimes Against Children and Sexu-
20	ally Violent Offender Registration Act. Such
21	grant program shall be known as the "Sex Of-
22	fender Management Assistance Program
23	(SOMA)".
24	"(ii) Uses of funds.—Grants awarded
25	under this subsection shall be—

1	"(I) distributed directly to the State
2	for distribution to State and local entities;
3	and
4	"(II) used for training, salaries,
5	equipment, materials, and other costs di-
6	rectly associated with complying with the
7	Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children
8	and Sexually Violent Offender Registration
9	Act.
10	"(2) Eligibility.—
11	"(i) APPLICATION.—To be eligible to re-
12	ceive a grant under this subsection, the chief
13	executive of a State shall, on an annual basis,
14	submit an application to the Director of the
15	Bureau of Justice Assistance (in such form and
16	containing such information as the Director
17	may reasonably require) assuring that—
18	"(I) the State complies with (or made
19	a good faith effort to comply with) the
20	Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children
21	and Sexually Violent Offender Registration
22	Act; and
23	"(II) where applicable, the State has
24	penalties comparable to or greater than

Federal penalties for crimes listed in such

Act.

The Director of the Bureau of Justice Assistance may waive the requirement of subclause (II) if a State demonstrates an overriding need for assistance under this subsection.

"(ii) Regulations.—

"(I) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the date of enactment of this subsection, the Director shall promulgate regulations to implement this subsection (including the information that must be included and the requirements that the States must meet) in submitting the applications required under this subsection. In allocating funds under this subsection, the Director may consider the annual number of sex offenders registered in each eligible state's monitoring and notification programs.

"(II) CERTAIN TRAINING PRO-GRAMS.—Prior to implementing this subsection, the Director of the Bureau of Justice Assistance shall study the feasibility of incorporating into the SOMA program the

1 activities of any technical assistance or 2 training program established as a result of section 40152 of the Violent Crime Control 3 and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 (Public Law 103–322). In a case in which incor-6 porating such activities into the SOMA 7 program will eliminate duplication of ef-8 forts or administrative costs, the Director 9 shall take administrative actions, as allow-10 able, and make recommendations to Con-11 gress to incorporate such activities into the 12 SOMA program prior to implementing the 13 SOMA program.".

- 14 (b) STUDY.—The Director of the Bureau of Justice 15 Assistance shall conduct a study to assess the efficacy of 16 the SOMA program and submit recommendations to Con-17 gress not later than March 1, 2000.
- 18 (c) Authorization for Appropriations.—There 19 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out subsection 20 (i) of section 170101 of the Violent Crime Control and 21 Law Enforcement Act of 1994 (42 U.S.C. 14211), 22 \$25,000,000 for each of fiscal years 1999 and 2000.
