A BILL

To modify the provision of law which provides a permanent appropriation for the compensation of Members of Congress, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Congressional Pay For
- 5 Performance Act".

SEC. 2. MODIFICATION OF PERMANENT APPROPRIATION

- 2 FOR MEMBERS' PAY.
- 3 Subsection (c) of section 130 of the joint resolution
- 4 entitled "Joint resolution making continuing appropria-
- 5 tions for the fiscal year 1982, and for other purposes"
- 6 (Public Law 97–51; 2 U.S.C. 31 note) is amended by
- 7 striking out "Effective" and by inserting "(1) Except to
- 8 the extent provided by paragraph (2), effective" and by
- 9 inserting at the end the following new paragraph:
- 10 "(2) If Congress has not passed all general appro-
- 11 priation bills before the beginning of a fiscal year, then
- 12 the appropriation contained in paragraph (1) shall not be
- 13 effective with respect to such fiscal year.".
- 14 SEC. 3. CONSIDERATION OF THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH
- 15 APPROPRIATION.
- 16 It shall not be in order in either the House of Rep-
- 17 resentatives or the Senate to consider the general appro-
- 18 priation bill making appropriations for the legislative
- 19 branch for any fiscal year unless and until all other gen-
- 20 eral appropriation bills for such fiscal year have been pre-
- 21 sented to the President for signature under section 7 of
- 22 Article I of the Constitution.
