Mr. Oberstar introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To authorize the Commandant of the Coast Guard to convey the real property comprising Coast Guard Light Station Two Harbors, located in Lake County, Minnesota, to the Lake County Historical Society.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CONVEYANCE OF TWO HARBORS LIGHTHOUSE,
- 4 MINNESOTA.
- 5 (a) AUTHORITY TO CONVEY.—
- 6 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subsection (b),
- 7 the Commandant of the Coast Guard may convey,
- 8 by an appropriate means of conveyance, all right,

- title, and interest of the United States in and to the real property comprising the Coast Guard Light Station Two Harbors, located in Lake County, Minnesota, to the Lake County Historical Society.
 - (2) IDENTIFICATION OF PROPERTY.—The Commandant may identify, define, describe, and determine the real property to be conveyed under this section.
 - (3) HISTORICAL ARTIFACTS.—Any historical artifact, including any lens or lantern, located on or associated with the real property conveyed at or before the time of the conveyance, shall remain the personal property of the United States.

(b) TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF CONVEYANCE.—

- (1) In General.—Any conveyance of real property under this section shall be made—
 - (A) without payment of consideration; and
- (B) subject to the terms and conditions the Commandant considers appropriate to protect the interests of the United States, including the reservation of easements or other rights on behalf of the United States.
- (2) Maintenance of Navigation functions.—Any conveyance of real property under this section shall be made subject to the terms and con-

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1	ditions that the Commandant considers necessary to
2	assure that—
3	(A) any active aid to navigation located on
4	the real property conveyed shall remain the per-
5	sonal property of the United States, and shall
6	continue to be operated and maintained by the
7	United States for as long as it is needed for
8	this purpose;
9	(B) the Lake County Historical Society
10	shall not in any manner interfere with, or allow
11	interference with, any aid to navigation without
12	express written permission from the Com-
13	mandant; and
14	(C) there is reserved to the United States
15	the right to—
16	(i) operate, maintain, install, improve,
17	relocate, replace, or remove any aid to
18	navigation located on the real property
19	conveyed;
20	(ii) make any changes to the real
21	property conveyed as may be necessary for
22	navigational purposes; and
23	(iii) enter the real property conveyed
24	at any time, without notice, for the pur-

- pose of exercising any of the rights reserved under this subparagraph.
 - (3) Obligation Limitation.—The Lake County Historical Society is not required by this section to maintain any active aid to navigation.
 - (4) HISTORIC PRESERVATION.—The Lake County Historical Society shall maintain the real property conveyed under this section in accordance with the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 470 et seq.) and the regulations promulgated under that Act.
 - (5) Maintenance Standard.—The Lake County Historical Society shall maintain the real property conveyed under this section, including any improvements, at its own cost and expense, in a proper, substantial, and workmanlike manner.
 - (6) Reversionary interest.—In addition to any term or condition established under this section, the conveyance of real property under this subsection shall be subject to the condition that all right, title, and interest in the real property conveyed under this section shall immediately revert to the United States, and be placed under the administrative control of the Administrator of General Services, if—

1	(A) the real property conveyed, or any part
2	thereof—
3	(i) ceases to be used as a nonprofit
4	center for the interpretation and preserva-
5	tion of maritime history;
6	(ii) ceases to be maintained in a man-
7	ner that ensures its present or future use
8	as a site for aids to navigation; or
9	(iii) ceases to be maintained in a man-
10	ner consistent with the provisions of the
11	National Historic Preservation Act of 1966
12	(16 U.S.C. 470 et seq.), or the regulations
13	promulgated under that Act; or
14	(B) at least 30 days before that reversion
15	the Commandant provides written notice to
16	Lake County Historical Society that the real
17	property conveyed is needed for national secu-
18	rity purposes.
19	(e) Definitions.—As used in this section—
20	(1) the term "aid to navigation" means equip-
21	ment used for navigation purposes, including any
22	light, antenna, sound signal, or other associated
23	lighthouse equipment; and
24	(2) the term "Lake County Historical Society"
25	means the Lake County Historical Society (a non-

- 1 profit corporation established under the laws of the
- 2 State of Minnesota), its parent organization or sub-
- 3 sidiary, if any, and its successors and assigns.

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
