 SECTION 1. BAN ON INTERNET OR MAIL-ORDER SALE OF

 AMMUNITION WITHOUT A FEDERAL LICENSE

 TO DEAL IN FIREARMS.

 Section 922(a)(1) of title 18, United States Code, is

6	"(C) except a licensed dealer, to ship or

9	SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT TO RECORD SALES OF MORE THAN
10	1,000 ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION.
11	Section 923(g)(3)(A) of title 18, United States Code
12	is amended by inserting after the 1st sentence the follow-
13	ing: "Each licensee shall prepare a report of multiple sales
14	or other dispositions whenever the licensee sells or other-
15	wise disposes of 1,000 or more rounds of ammunition
16	(other than .22 caliber rimfire ammunition, shotgun
17	shells, or primers) to the same person during 1 business
