6	(a) In General.—Not later than 90 days after the
7	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the
8	Interior shall install a plaque commemorating the Su-
9	preme Court decision in the case Dred Scott v. John San-
10	ford, 60 U.S. 393 (1857), at the entrance to the Old
11	Courthouse located in the Jefferson National Expansion
12	Memorial in Saint Louis, Missouri.
