- 6 SEC. 2. PROTECTION OF PROPERTY INTERESTS OF INNO-
- 7 CENT OWNERS IN FORFEITURE PROCEED-
- 8 INGS.
- 9 Unless the law specifically so provides, and by ref-
- 10 erence to this section overrides the rule of this section,

- 1 no law of the United States shall be interpreted to permit
- 2 or require the forfeiture of the property interest of an in-

3 nocent owner by reason of the criminal conduct of another.
