Mr. HAYWORTH introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To provide for the development of a management plan for the Woodland Lake Park tract in Apache–Sitgreaves National Forest in the State of Arizona reflecting the current use of the tract as a public park.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MANAGEMENT OF WOODLAND LAKE PARK**
4 **TRACT, APACHE–SITGREAVES NATIONAL**
5 **FOREST, ARIZONA, FOR RECREATIONAL PUR-**
6 **POSES.**

7 (a) MANAGEMENT PLAN REQUIRED.—Not later than
8 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the

1 Secretary of Agriculture, acting through the supervisor of
2 Apache–Sitgreaves National Forest in the State of Ari-
3 zona, shall prepare a management plan for the Woodland
4 Lake Park tract that is designed to ensure that the tract
5 is managed by the Forest Service for recreational purposes
6 consistent with the use of the tract as a public park by
7 the town of Pinetop-Lakeside, Arizona. The forest super-
8 visor shall prepare the management plan in consultation
9 with the town of Pinetop-Lakeside.

10 (b) PROHIBITION ON CONVEYANCE.—The Secretary
11 of Agriculture may not convey any right, title, or interest
12 of the United States in and to the Woodland Lake Park
13 tract unless the conveyance of the tract—

- 14 (1) is made to the town of Pinetop-Lakeside; or
15 (2) is specifically authorized by a law enacted
16 after the date of the enactment of this Act.

17 (c) DEFINITION.—The terms “Woodland Lake Park
18 tract” and “tract” mean the parcel of land in Apache–
19 Sitgreaves National Forest in the State of Arizona that
20 consists of approximately 583 acres and is known as the
21 Woodland Lake Park tract.
