- 1 U.S.C. 1883(c)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 2 lowing:
- 3 "(e) Management Prior to Referenda.—The
- 4 red snapper fishery in the Gulf of Mexico shall be man-
- 5 aged in accordance with such fishery management plans,
- 6 regulations, and other conservation and management as
- 7 applied to that fishery on April 13, 1998, except as may
- 8 be otherwise provided in a fishery management plan, plan
- 9 amendment, or regulation submitted and approved in ac-
- 10 cordance with this section after the date of enactment of
- 11 this subsection.".
- 12 (b) Regulations of No Force or Effect.—Reg-
- 13 ulations relating to the red snapper fishery in the Gulf
- 14 of Mexico that were published by the National Marine
- 15 Fisheries Service in the Federal Register on April 14,
- 16 1998 (63 Fed. Reg. 18144), shall have no force or effect.
