Mr. DeFazio (for himself, Ms. Furse, Mr. Blumenauer, and Ms. Hooley of Oregon) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To require firearms to be manufactured with child safety locks.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Firearm Child Safety
- 5 Lock Act of 1998".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON MANUFACTURE OF FIREARM
- 7 WITHOUT CHILD SAFETY LOCK.
- 8 (a) In General.—It shall be unlawful for any per-
- 9 son, in or affecting commerce, to manufacture a handgun
- 10 in the United States, unless a child safety lock which

- 1 meets the requirement of subsection (b) is attached to, or
- 2 is an integral part of, the firearm.
- 3 (b) Child Safety Lock Requirement.—A child
- 4 safety lock meets the requirement of this subsection if the
- 5 lock, while activated or attached to the firearm, prevents
- 6 the firearm from being discharged.
- 7 (c) Penalty.—The Secretary shall impose a civil
- 8 fine of \$5,000 on any person who violates subsection (a).
- 9 (d) Judicial Review.—Not later than 60 days after
- 10 an individual receives notice from the Secretary of a deci-
- 11 sion to impose a fine on the individual under this section,
- 12 the individual may bring an action against the Secretary
- 13 in any United States district court for de novo review of
- 14 the decision.
- 15 (e) Inapplicability to Governmental Enti-
- 16 TIES.—Subsection (a) shall not apply to conduct of, or au-
- 17 thorized by, the United States or any department or agen-
- 18 cy thereof, or any State or any department, agency, or
- 19 political subdivision thereof.
- 20 (f) Definitions.—In this section, the terms
- 21 "State", "firearm", "manufacturer", and "Secretary"
- 22 shall have the meanings given such terms in section
- 23 921(a) of title 18, United States Code.
