## A BILL

To authorize the Governors of States to limit the quantity of out-of-State municipal solid waste received for disposal at landfills and incinerators in their State.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. AUTHORITY TO LIMIT.
- 4 The Governor of a State may limit the quantity of
- 5 municipal solid waste generated outside of the State that
- 6 may be received for disposal at landfills and incinerators
- 7 in the State.

### 1 SEC. 2. DEFINITION.

2	For purposes of this Act, the term "municipal solid
3	waste" means refuse (and refuse-derived fuel) generated
4	by the general public or from a residential, commercial,
5	institutional, or industrial source (or any combination
6	thereof), consisting of paper, wood, yard wastes, plastics,
7	leather, rubber, or other combustible or noncombustible
8	materials such as metal or glass (or any combination
9	thereof). The term does not include any of the following:
10	(1) Any solid waste identified or listed as a haz-
11	ardous waste under section 3001 of the Solid Waste
12	Disposal Act.
13	(2) Any solid waste, including contaminated soil
14	and debris, resulting from a response action taken
15	under section 104 or 106 of the Comprehensive En-
16	vironmental Response, Compensation, and Liability
17	Act (42 U.S.C. 9604 or 9606) or a corrective action
18	taken under this Act.
19	(3) Any medical waste that is segregated from
20	or not mixed with municipal solid waste.
