- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Persian Gulf War Vet-
- 5 erans Compensation Act of 1997".

1	SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF PRESUMPTIVE PERIOD FOR MANI-
2	FESTATION OF CHRONIC DISABILITIES DUE
3	TO UNDIAGNOSED SYMPTOMS IN VETERANS
4	WHO SERVED IN THE PERSIAN GULF WAR.
5	Subsection (b) of section 1117 of title 38, United
6	States Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	"(b) The provisions of subsection (a) shall apply in
8	the case of a disability of a veteran becoming manifest
9	within 10 years after the last date on which the veteran
10	performed active military, naval, or air service in the
11	Southwest Asia theater of operations during the Persian
12	Gulf War.".
