A BILL

To redesignate the Marsh-Billings National Historical Park in the State of Vermont as the “Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller National Historical Park”.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REDESIGNATION.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Marsh-Billings National His-
5 torical Park in the State of Vermont is redesignated as
6 the “Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller National Historical
7 Park”.

8 (b) REFERENCES.—Any reference in a law, map, reg-
9 ulation, document, paper, or other record of the United
10 States to the park referred to in subsection (a) shall be

1 deemed to be a reference to the “Marsh-Billings-Rocke-
2 feller National Historical Park”.

3 (c) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

4 (1) Sections 1, 2(5), and 3(a) of Public Law
5 102–350 (16 U.S.C. 410vv note, 410vv(5), 410vv–
6 1(a)) are amended by striking “Marsh-Billings”
7 each place it appears and inserting “Marsh-Billings-
8 Rockefeller”.

9 (2) The section heading of each of sections 3
10 and 5 of Public Law 102–350 (16 U.S.C. 410vv–1,
11 410vv–3) is amended by striking “**MARSH-BIL-**
12 **LINGS**” and inserting “**MARSH-BILLINGS-ROCKE-**
13 **FELLER**”.

14 (3) Section 5(a) of Public Law 102–350 (16
15 U.S.C. 410vv–3(a)) is amended by striking “the
16 Marsh-Billings” and inserting “the Marsh-Billings-
17 Rockefeller”.
