To improve the adoption system of the District of Columbia.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "District of Columbia
- 5 Adoption Improvement Act of 1998".
- 6 SEC. 2. REPORT AND DATABASE.
- 7 (a) Report.—Not later than 30 days after the date
- 8 of the enactment of this Act, the Child Protective Services
- 9 Division of the Department of Human Services of the Dis-
- 10 trict of Columbia (hereafter in this Act referred to as the
- 11 "Division") shall report to Congress the number of chil-

- 1 dren under the jurisdiction of the Division who are legally
- 2 free for adoption.
- 3 (b) Database.—Not later than 90 days after the
- 4 date of the enactment of this Act, the Division shall estab-
- 5 lish a database listing and tracking each child under the
- 6 jurisdiction of the Division, with the goal of adoption or
- 7 becoming legally free for adoption.
- 8 SEC. 3. TRANSFER OF RECRUITMENT, HOME STUDY, AND
- 9 PLACEMENT FUNCTIONS TO PRIVATE SERV-
- 10 ICE PROVIDERS.
- 11 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than September 30,
- 12 1999, the Division shall enter into contracts with private
- 13 service providers in the Washington Metropolitan Area to
- 14 perform the recruitment, home study, and placement func-
- 15 tions of the Division.
- 16 (b) Competitive Bidding.—Any contract entered
- 17 into pursuant to subsection (a) shall be subject to a com-
- 18 petitive bidding process and outcome-based outsourcing.
