## A BILL

To provide grants to local educational agencies to provide a sufficient number of teachers and facilities to accommodate students who are disruptive in the classroom.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Constructive Learning
- 5 Environment Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Education is au-
- 8 thorized to award grants, taking into consideration the
- 9 priorities identified under subsection (b), to allow such

- 1 agencies to provide a sufficient number of teachers and
- 2 facilities to accommodate students who are disruptive in
- 3 the classroom.
- 4 (b) Grant Award Selection.—In awarding grants
- 5 under this section, the Secretary shall give priority to a
- 6 local educational agency—
- 7 (1) that serves a high number of low-income
- 8 students, determined by the number of students who
- 9 are eligible for free or reduced-price meals under the
- National School Lunch Act (7 U.S.C. 1751 et seq.);
- 11 or
- 12 (2) is located in a rural area.
- 13 (c) Duration.—A grant made under this Act may
- 14 be awarded for a period not to exceed 5 years.
- 15 SEC. 3. APPLICATION.
- A local educational agency that desires to receive a
- 17 grant under this Act shall submit an application to the
- 18 Secretary of Education at such time and in such form as
- 19 the Secretary may reasonably require.
- 20 SEC. 4. USES OF FUNDS.
- A local educational agency that receives a grant
- 22 award under this Act shall use the amounts received to
- 23 establish a program to provide a sufficient number of
- 24 teachers and facilities to accommodate students who are

- 1 disruptive in the classroom and to train teachers to effec-
- 2 tively educate such students.

### 3 SEC. 5. EVALUATION.

- 4 Not later than 30 months after the date of the enact-
- 5 ment of this Act, each local educational agency that re-
- 6 ceives a grant under this Act shall submit a report to the
- 7 Secretary of Education that evaluates the effectiveness of
- 8 accommodating students who are disruptive in the class-
- 9 room.

#### 10 SEC. 6. CONSTRUCTION.

- 11 Nothing in this Act may be construed to affect the
- 12 procedural safeguards or any other requirement of the In-
- 13 dividuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1400
- 14 et seq.).

### 15 SEC. 7. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- There are authorized to be appropriated \$50,000,000
- 17 for each of the fiscal years 1999 through 2001 to carry
- 18 out this Act.
