A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide the death penalty for the intentional transmission of the Human Immunodeficiency Virus to an innocent victim of a Federal offense.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protection for Innocent
- 5 Victims of AIDS Transmission Act".

1 SEC. 2. PROTECTION FOR INNOCENT VICTIMS OF AIDS

- 2 TRANSMISSION.
- 3 (a) In General.—Chapter 51 of title 18, United
- 4 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the follow-
- 5 ing:

6 "§ 1122. Protection for innocent victims of AIDS

7 transmission

- 8 "(a) In General.—Whoever, during the commission
- 9 of any Federal offense, knowingly engages in any sexual
- 10 contact with another person and through such contact
- 11 knowingly transfers the human immunodeficiency virus to
- 12 that person, without that person's consent, or attempts
- 13 to do so, shall be subject to the penalty of death, or shall
- 14 be imprisoned for life or any term of years.
- 15 "(b) Procedures.—For the purposes of chapter
- 16 228 of this title, an offense under this section shall be
- 17 deemed a homicide offense.".
- 18 (b) Clerical Amendment.—The table of sections
- 19 at the beginning of chapter 51 of title 18, United States
- 20 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:

"1122. Protection for innocent victims of AIDS transmission.".
