Mr. FOX of Pennsylvania introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To prohibit fund-raising at the White House and elsewhere.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “White House Fund-
5 Raising Prohibition Act of 1997”.

**6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITING FUND-RAISING AT THE WHITE HOUSE
7 AND ELSEWHERE.**

8 (a) PROHIBITION.—Whoever, on the grounds or in
9 the buildings, including private residential areas, of an of-
10 ficial residence or retreat of the President or Vice Presi-
11 dent, solicits, receives, or rewards a political contribution

1 shall be fined under title 18, United States Code, or im-
2 prisoned not more than three years, or both.

3 (b) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of subsection (a):

4 (1) GROUNDS.—The term “grounds” means all
5 areas of an official residence or retreat of the Presi-
6 dent or Vice President which are routinely protected
7 by or to which access is routinely controlled by the
8 United States Secret Service.

9 (2) POLITICAL CONTRIBUTION.—The term “po-
10 litical contribution” means an offering of money,
11 property, or services to or for the benefit of an an-
12 nounced or unannounced political candidate, or a po-
13 litical party, or an organization promoting an an-
14 nounced or unannounced political candidate, or a po-
15 litical party, or a political agenda.
