A BILL

To provide for a change with respect to the requirements for a Canadian border boat landing permit pursuant to section 235 of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CHANGE IN CANADIAN BORDER BOAT LANDING
- 4 PERMIT REQUIREMENTS.
- 5 Not later than 60 days after the date of the enact-
- 6 ment of this Act, the Attorney General, in consultation
- 7 with the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturaliza-
- 8 tion, shall issue revised regulations for the implementation
- 9 of section 235 of the Immigration and Nationality Act

- 1 with respect to the requirement that certain individuals
- 2 entering the United States from Canada by boat obtain
- 3 a landing permit. The revised regulations shall provide
- 4 that, in the case of a United States citizen traveling in
- 5 a boat of not more than 65 feet in length (including a
- 6 boat used for commercial purposes) on a trip between the
- 7 United States and Canada of not more than 72 hours du-
- 8 ration, the citizen need not obtain such a permit if the
- 9 citizen carries a United States passport for the duration
- 10 of the trip, regardless of whether the citizen is a passenger
- 11 on, an owner of, or an operator of, the boat.
