A BILL

To restrict the Food and Drug Administration from penalizing retailers for face-to-face tobacco sales that are in accordance with State law.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. IDENTIFICATION AND TOBACCO SALES.
- 4 If a State has in effect a law which prohibits the sale
- 5 of cigarettes and smokeless tobacco products to individuals
- 6 under age 18 or 19, the Secretary of Health and Human
- 7 Services may not, through the Food and Drug Administra-
- 8 tion, take enforcement action against a retailer of ciga-
- 9 rettes and smokeless tobacco products for the sale in such
- 10 State of cigarettes or smokeless tobacco products if such

- 1 a sale is a face-to-face transaction and is conducted in ac-
- 2 cordance with such State law to an individual who is of

3 legal age.
