AN ACT

To establish a Commission on Structural Alternatives for the Federal Courts of Appeals.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1	SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT AND FUNCTIONS OF COMMIS-				
2	SION.				
3	(a) Establishment.—There is established a Com-				
4	mission on Structural Alternatives for the Federal Courts				
5	of Appeals (hereinafter referred to as the "Commission")				
6	(b) Functions.—The functions of the Commission				
7	shall be to—				
8	(1) study the present division of the United				
9	States into the several judicial circuits;				
10	(2) study the structure and alignment of the				
11	Federal Court of Appeals system, with particular				
12	reference to the Ninth Circuit; and				
13	(3) report to the President and the Congress its				
14	recommendations for such changes in circuit bound-				
15	aries or structure as may be appropriate for the ex-				
16	peditious and effective disposition of the caseload of				
17	the Federal Courts of Appeals, consistent with fun-				
18	damental concepts of fairness and due process.				
19	SEC. 2. MEMBERSHIP.				
20	(a) Composition.—The Commission shall be com-				
21	posed of 10 members appointed as follows:				
22	(1) One member appointed by the President of				
23	the United States.				
24	(2) One member appointed by the Chief Justice				
25	of the United States.				

- 1 (3) Two members appointed by the Majority
- 2 Leader of the Senate.
- 3 (4) Two members appointed by the Minority
- 4 Leader of the Senate.
- 5 (5) Two members appointed by the Speaker of
- 6 the House of Representatives.
- 7 (6) Two members appointed by the Minority
- 8 Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 9 (b) APPOINTMENT.—The members of the Commis-
- 10 sion shall be appointed within 60 days after the date of
- 11 the enactment of this Act.
- 12 (c) Vacancy.—Any vacancy in the Commission shall
- 13 be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 14 (d) Chair.—The Commission shall elect a Chair and
- 15 Vice Chair from among its members.
- 16 (e) Quorum.—Six members of the Commission shall
- 17 constitute a quorum, but three may conduct hearings.
- 18 SEC. 3. COMPENSATION.
- 19 (a) In General.—Members of the Commission who
- 20 are officers, or full-time employees, of the United States
- 21 shall receive no additional compensation for their services,
- 22 but shall be reimbursed for travel, subsistence, and other
- 23 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of duties
- 24 vested in the Commission, but not in excess of the maxi-

- 1 mum amounts authorized under section 456 of title 28,
- 2 United States Code.
- 3 (b) Private Members.—Members of the Commis-
- 4 sion from private life shall receive \$200 for each day (in-
- 5 cluding travel time) during which the member is engaged
- 6 in the actual performance of duties vested in the Commis-
- 7 sion, plus reimbursement for travel, subsistence, and other
- 8 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of such
- 9 duties, but not in excess of the maximum amounts author-
- 10 ized under section 456 of title 28, United States Code.

11 SEC. 4. PERSONNEL.

- 12 (a) Executive Director.—The Commission may
- 13 appoint an Executive Director who shall receive compensa-
- 14 tion at a rate not exceeding the rate prescribed for level
- 15 V of the Executive Schedule under section 5316 of title
- 16 5, United States Code.
- 17 (b) STAFF.—The Executive Director, with the ap-
- 18 proval of the Commission, may appoint and fix the com-
- 19 pensation of such additional personnel as the Executive
- 20 Director determines necessary, without regard to the pro-
- 21 visions of title 5, United States Code, governing appoint-
- 22 ments in the competitive service or the provisions of chap-
- 23 ter 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53 of such title relat-
- 24 ing to classification and General Schedule pay rates. Com-
- 25 pensation under this subsection shall not exceed the an-

- 1 nual maximum rate of basic pay for a position above GS-
- 2 15 of the General Schedule under section 5108 of title
- 3 5, United States Code.
- 4 (c) Experts and Consultants.—The Executive
- 5 Director may procure personal services of experts and con-
- 6 sultants as authorized by section 3109 of title 5, United
- 7 States Code, at rates not to exceed the highest level pay-
- 8 able under the General Schedule pay rates under section
- 9 5332 of title 5, United States Code.
- 10 (d) Services.—The Administrative Office of the
- 11 United States Courts shall provide administrative services,
- 12 including financial and budgeting services, to the Commis-
- 13 sion on a reimbursable basis. The Federal Judicial Center
- 14 shall provide necessary research services to the Commis-
- 15 sion on a reimbursable basis.

16 SEC. 5. INFORMATION.

- 17 The Commission is authorized to request from any
- 18 department, agency, or independent instrumentality of the
- 19 Government any information and assistance the Commis-
- 20 sion determines necessary to carry out its functions under
- 21 this Act. Each such department, agency, and independent
- 22 instrumentality is authorized to provide such information
- 23 and assistance to the extent permitted by law when re-
- 24 quested by the Chair of the Commission.

SEC. 6. REPORT.

- 2 No later than 18 months following the date on which
- 3 its sixth member is appointed in accordance with section
- 4 2(b), the Commission shall submit its report to the Presi-
- 5 dent and the Congress. The Commission shall terminate
- 6 90 days after the date of the submission of its report.

7 SEC. 7. CONGRESSIONAL CONSIDERATION.

- 8 No later than 60 days after the submission of the
- 9 report, the Committees on the Judiciary of the House of
- 10 Representatives and the Senate shall act on the report.

11 SEC. 8. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- There are authorized to be appropriated to the Com-
- 13 mission such sums, not to exceed \$900,000, as may be
- 14 necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act. Such sums
- 15 as are appropriated shall remain available until expended.
