A BILL

To establish an Office on Women's Health within the Department of Health and Human Services.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Women's Health Office
- 5 Act of 1997".

1	SEC. 2. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES OFFICE ON WOM-
2	EN'S HEALTH.
3	Part A of title II of the Public Health Service Act
4	(42 U.S.C. 202 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
5	the following:
6	"SEC. 229. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES OFFICE ON
7	WOMEN'S HEALTH.
8	"(a) Establishment of Office.—There is estab-
9	lished within the Office of the Secretary an Office on
10	Women's Health (hereafter referred to in this section as
11	the 'Office'). The Office on Women's Health shall be head-
12	ed by a Deputy Assistant Secretary for Women's Health.
13	"(b) Duties.—The Office shall, with respect to the
14	health concerns of women—
15	"(1) establish short-range and long-range goals
16	and objectives and coordinate all activities within the
17	Department of Health and Human Services that re-
18	late to disease prevention, health promotion, service
19	delivery, research, and public and health care profes-
20	sional education concerning women;
21	"(2) provide expert advice and consultation to
22	the Secretary concerning scientific, legal ethical, and
23	policy issues relating to women's health;
24	"(3) monitor the Department of Health and
25	Human Services offices, agencies, and regional ac-
26	tivities regarding women's health and coordinate and

1	stimulate activities of such departmental and agency
2	offices on women's health;
3	"(4) establish a Department of Health and
4	Human Services Coordinating Committee on Wom-
5	en's Health to be chaired by the Deputy Assistant
6	Secretary for Women's Health which shall be com-
7	posed of senior level representatives from each of the
8	agencies and offices of the Department of Health
9	and Human Services;
10	"(5) establish a National Women's Health In-
11	formation Center to—
12	"(A) facilitate the exchange of information
13	regarding matters relating to health informa-
14	tion and health promotion, preventive health
15	services, research advances, and education in
16	the appropriate use of health care;
17	"(B) facilitate access to such information;
18	"(C) assist in the analysis of issues and
19	problems relating to the matters described in
20	this paragraph; and
21	"(D) provide technical assistance with re-
22	spect to the exchange of information (including
23	facilitating the development of materials for
24	such technical assistance);

- 1 "(6) coordinate efforts to promote women's 2 health programs and policies in the private sector; 3 and
- "(7) through publications and any other means appropriate, provide for the exchange of information between the Office and recipients of grants, contracts, and agreements under subsection (c), and between the Office and health professionals and the general public.
- 10 "(c) Grants and Contracts Regarding Du-11 ties.—
- "(1) AUTHORITY.—In carrying out subsection
 (b), the Secretary, acting through the Office, may
 make grants to, and enter into cooperative agreements, contracts, and interagency agreements with
 public and nonprofit private entities, agencies, and
 organizations.
 - "(2) EVALUATION AND DISSEMINATION.—The Office shall directly or through contracts with public and private entities, agencies, and organization, provide for evaluations of projects carried out with financial assistance provided under paragraph (1) and for the dissemination of information developed as a result of such projects.

- 11 "(f) Transfer.—There are transferred to the Office,
- 12 all functions exercised by the Office on Women's Health
- 13 of the Public Health Service prior to the date of enactment
- 14 of this section, including all personnel and compensation
- 15 authority, all delegation and assignment authority, and all
- 16 remaining appropriations. All orders, determinations,
- 17 rules, regulations, permits, agreements, grants, contracts,
- 18 certificates, licenses, registrations, privileges, and other
- 19 administrative actions—
- 20 "(1) which have been issued, made, granted, or
- allowed to become effective by the President, any
- Federal agency or official thereof, or by a court of
- competent jurisdiction, in the performance of func-

5	shall continue in effect according to their terms until

7	accordance with law by the President, the Assistant Sec-
8	retary for Women's Health or other authorized official, a
9	court of competent jurisdiction, or by operation of law.".

11	TION OFFICE OF WOMEN'S HEALTH.

13	(42 U.S.C. 241 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
14	the following:
15	"CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION
16	OFFICE OF WOMEN'S HEALTH
17	"Sec. 310A. (a) Establishment.—There is estab-
18	lished within the Office of the Director of the Centers for
19	Disease Control and Prevention an office to be known as
20	the Office of Women's Health (hereafter referred to in this
21	section as the 'Office'). The Office shall be headed by a
22	director who shall be appointed by the Director of the
23	Centers.
24	"(b) Purpose.—The Director of the Office shall—
25	"(1) determine the current level of the Centers
26	activity regarding women's health conditions, across

- age, biological, and sociocultural contexts, in all aspects of the Centers work, including prevention programs, public and professional education, services, and treatment;

22	trials of treatments and therapies;
23	"(E) supporting the development and ex-
24	pansion of clinical trials of treatments and
25	therapies for which obtaining such data has

1	been determined to be an appropriate function;

3	"(F) encouraging the Food and Drug Ad-
4	ministration Centers to conduct and support
5	such studies, including such clinical trials.

7	and January 31 of each second year thereafter, the Direc-
8	tor shall prepare and submit to the Director of the Office
9	on Women's Health established under section 229 of the
10	Public Health Service Act, a report describing the activi-
