- 4 This Act may be cited as the "No Hands Bridge Res-

1	SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE
2	STABILIZATION AND REPAIR OF NO HANDS
3	BRIDGE.
4	(a) Authorization.—In addition to any other
5	amounts authorized or available, there are authorized to
6	be appropriated to the Secretary of the Interior \$700,000
7	for the stabilization and repair of damages to the Moun-
8	tain Quarries Railroad Bridge, commonly known as No
9	Hands Bridge, caused by heavy rains and flooding in Cali-
10	fornia in December 1996 and January 1997.
11	(b) Use.—Amounts may be appropriated under this
12	section for, among other activities, the following:
13	(1) The immediate stabilization and expeditious
14	opening of the bridge for such annual events as the
15	Western States 100 Mile Endurance Run and the
16	Tevis Cup.
17	(2) The permanent repair of the bridge's east
18	pier as necessary to allow for unrestricted use of the
19	bridge.
20	(c) Future Use.—Nothing in this section or any fu-
21	ture use or designation of the Mountain Quarries Bridge
22	shall preclude the future development of the Auburn Dam
23	Project.
