A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to eliminate the requirement that States pay unemployment compensation on the basis of services performed by election workers.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That (a) paragraph (3) of section 3309(b) of the Internal
- 4 Revenue Code of 1986 (relating to exception for certain
- 5 services) is amended by striking "or" at the end of sub-
- 6 paragraph (D), by adding "or" at the end of subpara-
- 7 graph (E), and by inserting after subparagraph (E) the
- 8 following new subparagraph:

1	"(F) as an election official or election
2	worker if the amount of remuneration received
3	by the individual during the calendar year for
4	services as an election official or election worker
5	is less than \$1,000;".

6 (b) The amendment made by subsection (a) shall 7 apply to services performed after the date of the enact-8 ment of this Act.
