## RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives with respect to the failure of the Executive to take care that the laws be faithfully executed.

1 Resolved, That it is the sense of the House of Rep2 resentatives that—
3 (1) the refusal of the Attorney General to seek
4 application for an independent counsel pursuant to
5 a request for the same from the majority of the
6 members of the House Committee on the Judiciary
7 in letters dated March 12, 1997, and September 3,

1997, has undermined the confidence of Congress in

- the effectiveness of Federal law enforcement in those
  investigations; and
  - (2) the failure to send to the Senate a nomination for the now vacant office of Assistant Attorney General for the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice, while allowing the functions of that Assistant Attorney General to be carried out by a person acting in apparent violation of the Vacancies Act, has resulted in the absence of prosecutors accountable to Congress as well as the Executive with respect to criminal-law-related investigations of Executive branch officials;
    - (3) this pattern of conduct constitutes a failure to take care that the laws be faithfully executed.
