Mr. Farr of California submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Commerce

RESOLUTION

- Congratulating the City of Gonzales, California, on the 50th anniversary of its incorporation and recognizing the contribution of the city's residents to the Nation.
- Whereas in 1872 the Southern Pacific Railroad laid tracks through what is now Gonzales, California;
- Whereas soon after the tracks were laid the railroad erected a depot at the present location of Gonzales to allow trains to stop for freight and passengers;
- Whereas in 1874 a town of 50 blocks was laid out around the depot by Mariano and Alfredo Gonzales on land deeded from Mexico to their father;
- Whereas by 1894 the population of the town had reached 500 residents;

- Whereas in the 1890's Swiss immigrants established in the town what became a thriving dairy industry;
- Whereas the process for producing condensed milk was discovered by a local resident;
- Whereas the Alpine Condensary was established in the town at the turn of the century to produce the world's first condensed milk;
- Whereas the town continued to grow after vegetable farming displaced the dairy industry in the 1920's as the region's most important industry;
- Whereas the City of Gonzales was incorporated on January 14, 1947;
- Whereas the City of Gonzales has grown into an important economic center for the surrounding region, one of the richest and most fertile in the state of California; and
- Whereas, despite its growth, the City of Gonzales has maintained its small town charm: Now, therefore, be it

 - 3 nia, on the 50th anniversary of its incorporation,
 - 4 and on its growth into a major economic center
 - 5 which has maintained its small town charm; and

 - 7 dents of Gonzales have made to the development and
 - 8 improvement of the Nation.
