Mr. Pastor submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

RESOLUTION

Recognizing Hispanic culture in the United States.

- Whereas the Hispanic community represents 10 percent of the United States population and is expected to become the largest minority group in the United States in approximately 10 years;
- Whereas by 2035, 1 in 5 Americans will be Hispanic;
- Whereas Hispanics distinguish themselves as a community for fostering connections rooted in the Spanish language;
- Whereas Hispanics diverse and vibrant culture includes elements originating in Spain, North America, Central America, South America, the Caribbean, and the Far East;
- Whereas Hispanics share deep family values, recognize their obligations to the less fortunate in society, protect their

children, cherish freedom, and fulfill their patriotic duty to defend their country;

- Whereas many Hispanic men and women have served this country with distinction, making important contributions in the arts and sciences, the business world, academia, government, agriculture, and the Armed Forces;
- Whereas Hispanics have served in the United States Armed Forces in proportions much larger than their percentage of the population;
- Whereas American society can reap great benefits from greater exposure to Hispanic arts and culture;
- Whereas Hispanics constitute only 1 percent of the participants in most major entertainment categories, such as writers, producers, directors, actors, and filmmakers; and
- Whereas the need to increase the visual presence of Hispanics and create a place in the national conscience can only be done through the visual realm of entertainment: Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 Resolved, That the House of Representatives—
 - 2 (1) recognizes that Hispanics are an example of 3 community and patriotism and have made rich con-4 tributions to this country;
 - (2) wholeheartedly endorses the efforts of the Foundation for the Arts to raise scholarships at the graduate school level for Hispanics interested in film, theater, television, and the music industry;
- 9 (3) salutes actor Jimmy Smits for his leader-10 ship and commitment to bring excellence to the His-
