RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 901) to preserve the sovereignty of the United States over public lands and acquired lands owned by the United States, and to preserve State sovereignty and private property rights in non-Federal lands surrounding those public lands and acquired lands.

- 1 Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
- 3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-2 ation of the bill (H.R. 901) to preserve the sovereignty 3 of the United States over public lands and acquired lands 4 owned by the United States, and to preserve State sovereignty and private property rights in non-Federal lands surrounding those public lands and acquired lands. The 6 first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. General 8 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman 10 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Resources. After general debate the bill shall be considered 11 12 for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in 14 15 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Resources now printed in the bill. The committee 16 17 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be consid-18 ered as read. During consideration of the bill for amend-19 ment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may 20 accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether the 21 Member offering an amendment has caused it to be print-22 ed in the portion of the Congressional Record designated 23 for that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered as read. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee

- 1 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
- 2 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may
- 3 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
- 4 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
- 5 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.
- 6 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
- 7 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without
- 8 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
- 9 or without instructions.
