## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 901) to preserve the sovereignty of the United States over public lands and acquired lands owned by the United States, and to preserve State sovereignty and private property rights in non-Federal lands surrounding those public lands and acquired lands.

- 1       *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
- 2 it shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
- 3 901) to preserve the sovereignty of the United States over

1 public lands and acquired lands owned by the United  
2 States, and to preserve State sovereignty and private prop-  
3 erty rights in non-Federal lands surrounding those public  
4 lands and acquired lands. The bill shall be considered as  
5 read for amendment. The amendment in the nature of a  
6 substitute recommended by the Committee on Resources  
7 now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted. The  
8 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the  
9 bill, as amended, and any further amendment thereto to  
10 final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one  
11 hour of debate on the bill, as amended, which shall be  
12 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-  
13 ing minority member of the Committee on Resources; (2)  
14 one further motion to amend by Representative Miller of  
15 California or his designee, which shall be considered as  
16 read and shall be separately debatable for sixty minutes  
17 equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an  
18 opponent; and (3) one motion to recommit with or without  
19 instructions.
