H. Res. 436

In the House of Representatives, U.S.,

May 21, 1998.

Resolved, That upon the adoption of this resolution it shall be in order to consider in the House the resolution (H. Res. 432) expressing the sense of the House of Representatives concerning the President's assertions of executive privilege. The resolution shall be considered as read for amendment. The resolution shall be debatable for one hour equally divided and controlled by the Majority Leader or his designee and a Member opposed to the resolution. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the resolution to final adoption without intervening motion.

SEC. 2. After disposition of or postponement of further proceedings on House Resolution 432, it shall be in order to consider in the House the resolution (H. Res. 433) calling upon the President of the United States to urge full cooperation by his former political appointees and friends and their associates with congressional investigations. The resolution shall be considered as read for amendment. The resolution shall be debatable for one hour equally divided and controlled

by the Majority Leader or his designee and a Member opposed to the resolution. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the resolution to final adoption without intervening motion.
