### **RESOLUTION**

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4104) making appropriations for the Treasury Department, the United States Postal Service, the Executive Office of the President, and certain Independent Agencies, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, and for other purposes.

- 1 Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
- 3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
- 4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
- 5 ation of the bill (H.R. 4104) making appropriations for

the Treasury Department, the United States Postal Service, the Executive Office of the President, and certain 3 Independent Agencies, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. Points of order against consideration of the bill for failure to comply with clause 6 2(1)(6) of rule XI or clause 7 of rule XXI are waived. Gen-8 eral debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair-10 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appropriations. After general debate the bill shall be con-11 12 sidered for amendment under the five-minute rule. The amendments printed in part 1 of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution shall be con-14 15 sidered as adopted in the House and in the Committee of the Whole. Points of order against provisions in the 16 bill, as amended, for failure to comply with clause 2 or 6 of rule XXI are waived except as follows: page 104, line 18 14, through page 106, line 12. The amendments printed 19 in part 2 of the report of the Committee on Rules may 21 be offered only by a Member designated in the report and only at the appropriate point in the reading of the bill, 23 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to

amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-2 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee 3 of the Whole. All points of order against the amendments printed in the report are waived. During consideration of the bill for further amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether the Member offering an amendment 8 has caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in clause 6 of 10 rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered as read. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole 11 may: (1) postpone until a time during further consider-12 ation in the Committee of the Whole a request for a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five 14 15 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any postponed question that follows another electronic vote 16 without intervening business, provided that the minimum time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-18 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-19 20 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise 21 and report the bill, as amended, to the House with such 22 amendments as may have been adopted. The previous 23 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without intervening

- 2 structions.
