Mr. Radanovich submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

RESOLUTION

Calling upon William Jefferson Clinton to immediately resign the Office of President of the United States.

- Whereas William Jefferson Clinton has abused the Office of President of the United States through the use of the power of the Office to seduce an employee, and by using the public facilities of the Office for said seduction;
- Whereas William Jefferson Clinton's misconduct, if engaged in under similar circumstances by any other citizen, would result in that citizen's dismissal from employment;
- Whereas William Jefferson Clinton has used the resources of the Office of President of the United States, including employees, appointees, and associates, to cover up his actions and to obstruct justice by withholding information from a duly constituted Independent Counsel investigation;

Whereas William Jefferson Clinton has subverted the laws of the United States by providing false testimony, by refusing to provide duly subpoenaed information, and by having 267 "lapses of memory" during the course of his sworn testimony; and

Whereas as a result of these actions, William Jefferson Clinton has diminished the Office of President of the United States by removing the dignity, honor, integrity, and trust in the Office necessary for the effective conduct of the affairs of the United States of America: Now, therefore, be it

- 1 Resolved, That the House of Representatives hereby
- 2 calls upon William Jefferson Clinton to immediately resign
- 3 the Office of President of the United States.
