RESOLUTION

- Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that the President should personally reimburse the Federal Government for the costs incurred by the Office of Independent Counsel since January 26, 1998.
- Whereas on January 26, 1998, and on various occasions thereafter, the President denied having a relationship with Monica Lewinsky;
- Whereas on August 17, 1998, the President acknowledged for the first time that these denials were false;
- Whereas the President's denials caused the Office of Independent Counsel to incur significant costs investigating the Monica Lewinsky matter, which would have been

avoided had the President been forthright from the beginning; and

Whereas the costs incurred by the Office of Independent Counsel since January 26, 1998, should be borne personally by the President, who caused the costs to be incurred, and not by the American taxpayer: Now, therefore, be it
