RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 852) to amend chapter 35 of title 44, United States Code, popularly known as the Paperwork Reduction Act, to minimize the burden of Federal paperwork demands upon small businesses, educational and nonprofit institutions, Federal contractors, State and local governments, and other persons through the sponsorship and use of alternative information technologies.

Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this 1 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of 3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration of the bill (H.R. 852) to amend chapter 35 of title 44, United States Code, popularly known as the Paper-6 work Reduction Act, to minimize the burden of Federal 8 paperwork demands upon small businesses, educational and nonprofit institutions, Federal contractors, State and 10 local governments, and other persons through the sponsorship and use of alternative information technologies. The 12 first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman 14 15 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Small Business. After general debate the bill shall be considered 16 for amendment under the five-minute rule. Each section shall be considered as read. During consideration of the 18 bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of 19 20 the Whole may accord priority in recognition on the basis 21 of whether the Member offering an amendment has caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional Record 23 designated for that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered as read. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment

- 1 the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House
- 2 with such amendments as may have been adopted. The
- 3 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
- 4 bill and amendments thereto to final passage without in-
- 5 tervening motion except one motion to recommit with or
- 6 without instructions.
