A BILL

To establish a moratorium on large fishing vessels in Atlantic herring and mackerel fisheries.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. MORATORIUM.
- 4 (a) In General.—Notwithstanding any provision of
- 5 the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Manage-
- 6 ment Act (16 U.S.C. 1801 et seq.), no large fishing vessel
- 7 may engage in fishing for Atlantic herring or Atlantic
- 8 mackerel within the United States exclusive economic zone
- 9 until—

- (1) the National Marine Fisheries Service has completed a new population survey concerning the abundance of the discrete spawning stocks of Atlantic herring and Atlantic mackerel; and
 - (2) the Secretary of Commerce has approved and implemented fishery management plans developed by the appropriate regional fishery management council for Atlantic herring and Atlantic mackerel, that specifically allow large fishing vessels to participate in those fisheries.

(b) Definitions.—In this section:

- (1) FISHERY MANAGEMENT PLAN.—The term "fishery management plan" means a fishery management plan prepared under section 303 of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1853).
- (2) Large Fishing Vessel.—The term "large fishing vessel" means a fishing vessel (as that term is defined in section 3 of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1802)) of the United States that is equal to or greater than 165 feet in length overall and has an engine of more than 3,000 horsepower.
- (3) REGIONAL FISHERY MANAGEMENT COUN-CIL.—The term "regional fishery management coun-

- cil" means a regional fishery management council
 established under section 302 of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (16
 U.S.C. 1852).
- 5 (4) UNITED STATES EXCLUSIVE ECONOMIC
 6 ZONE.—The term "United States exclusive economic
 7 zone" means the exclusive economic zone established
 8 by Proclamation No. 5030, issued on March 10,
 9 1983.
