 SECTION 1. FARM-RELATED EXEMPTIONS FROM CERTAIN

 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS TRANSPORTATION

 REQUIREMENTS.

 (a) IN GENERAL.—No provision of a final rule relating to the intrastate transportation of hazardous materials
- 8 issued by the Secretary of Transportation under the rule-
- 9 making proceeding under docket number HM-200 that
- 10 prohibits a State from granting an exemption for not-for-

- 1 hire intrastate transportation by farmers and farm-related
- 2 service industries shall take effect with respect to that not-

- 5 (b) Date.—The date specified in this subsection is
- 6 the later of—
- 7 (1) October 1, 1999; or
- 8 (2) the date on which funds are authorized to
- 9 be appropriated for fiscal year 1998 to carry out
- 10 chapter 51 of title 49, United States Code.
