## A BILL

To terminate the effectiveness of certain amendments to the foreign repair station rules of the Federal Aviation Administration, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Aircraft Repair Station
- 5 Safety Act of 1997".

1	SEC. 2. TERMINATION OF CERTAIN FOREIGN REPAIR STA-
2	TION RULES.
3	The amendments published by the Federal Aviation
4	Administration on November 22, 1988 (53 Fed. Reg.
5	47375 and 47376), to parts 135 and 145 of title 14, Code
6	of Federal Regulations, shall not be effective after the date
7	of the enactment of this Act.
8	SEC. 3. APPLICABILITY OF CERTAIN REGULATIONS.
9	(a) Definitions.—
10	(1) Domestic Repair Station or Shop.—The
11	term "domestic repair station or shop" means a re-
12	pair station or shop that—
13	(A) is described in section 44707(a)(2) of
14	title 49, United States Code; and
15	(B) is located in the United States.
16	(2) Foreign repair station or shop.—The
17	term "foreign repair station or shop" means a repair
18	station or shop that—
19	(A) is described in section 44707(a)(2) of
20	title 49, United States Code; and
21	(B) is located outside of the United States.
22	(b) APPLICABILITY OF STANDARDS.—All standards
23	set forth in regulations issued by the Federal Aviation Ad-
24	ministration that apply to a domestic repair station or
25	shop and the personnel employed by a domestic repair sta-
26	tion or shop shall apply to a foreign repair station or shop

1	and the personnel employed by a foreign repair station or
2	shop in the same manner, and to the same extent, as those
3	standards apply to a domestic repair station or shop and
4	the personnel employed by a domestic repair station or
5	shop.
6	SEC. 4. REVOCATION OF REPAIR STATION CERTIFICATES
7	FOR USE OF UNCERTIFIED OR SUBSTANDARD
8	PARTS.
9	Section 44707 of title 49, United States Code, is
10	amended—
11	(1) by inserting "(a) In General.—" before
12	"The Administrator"; and
13	(2) by adding at the end the following:
14	"(b) REVOCATION OF REPAIR STATION CERTIFI-
15	CATES FOR USE OF UNCERTIFIED OR SUBSTANDARD
16	Parts.—
17	"(1) Definitions.—In this subsection, with re-
18	spect to a part described in paragraph (2)—
19	"(A) the term 'substandard' shall have the
20	meaning given that term by the Administrator;
21	and
22	"(B) the term 'uncertified' means that the
23	part does not conform to the requirements of
24	an applicable certificate issued under section
25	44702

1	"(2) In General.—The Administrator shall
2	issue an order revoking an air agency certificate is-
3	sued under section 44702 for a repair station or
4	shop described in subsection (a)(2) if the Adminis-
5	trator finds that the owner or any member of the
6	personnel of the station or shop knowingly, in the
7	repair or overhaul of an aircraft, used an uncertified
8	or substandard—
9	"(A) airframe, engine, propeller, or appli-
10	ance; or
11	"(B) other part.".
