- 4 OR OTHER CHARACTERISTICS OF PERISH-
- 5 ABLE AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES.
- 6 Section 2(5) of the Perishable Agricultural Commod-
- 7 ities Act, 1930 (7 U.S.C. 499b(5)), is amended by adding

- 1 at the end the following: "If a court of competent jurisdic-
- 2 tion finds that a person has intentionally, or with reckless
- 3 disregard, engaged in a misrepresentation described in
- 4 this paragraph and the misrepresentation resulted in a se-
- 5 rious bodily injury (as defined in section 1365(g) of title
- 6 18, United States Code) to, or death of, an individual, the
- 7 person shall be guilty of a Class D felony that is punish-
- 8 able under title 18, United States Code."
