1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

3	SECTION 1. TERMINATION OF INTERNAL REVENUE CODE
4	OF 1986.
5	No tax shall be imposed by the Internal Revenue
6	Code of 1986—
7	(1) for any taxable year beginning after Decem-
8	ber 31, 2001, and
9	(2) in the case of any tax not imposed on the
10	basis of a taxable year, on any taxable event or for
11	any period after December 31, 2001.

1 SEC. 2. STRUCTURE OF NEW FEDERAL TAX SYSTEM.

2	The Congress hereby declares that any new Federal
3	tax system should be a simple and fair system that—
4	(1) applies a low rate to all Americans,
5	(2) requires a supermajority of both Houses of
6	Congress to raise taxes,
7	(3) provides tax relief for working Americans,
8	(4) protects the rights of taxpayers and reduces
9	tax collection abuses,
10	(5) eliminates the bias against savings and in-
11	vestment,
12	(6) promotes economic growth and job creation,
13	(7) does not penalize marriage or families, and
14	(8) protects the integrity of Social Security and
15	Medicare.
