Mr. Moynihan introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

# A BILL

To provide for the declassification of the journal kept by Glenn T. Seaborg while serving as Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 (1) Whereas Dr. Glenn T. Seaborg is a truly great
- 5 American who has made indispensable contributions in the
- 6 development of nuclear energy.
- 7 (2) Whereas Dr. Seaborg is the co-discoverer of plu-
- 8 tonium and eight other elements and as a result of these
- 9 discoveries was awarded the 1951 Nobel Prize for chem-
- 10 istry.

- 1 (3) Whereas while serving as Chairman of the Atomic
- 2 Energy Commission (AEC), Dr. Seaborg maintained a
- 3 journal consisting of a diary, correspondence, announce-
- 4 ments, minutes of meetings, and other documents of his-
- 5 torical value.
- 6 (4) Whereas in preparing the journal, Dr. Seaborg
- 7 took care to include only information which was not classi-
- 8 fied and could be made public.
- 9 (5) Whereas before leaving the Atomic Energy Com-
- 10 mission, Dr. Seaborg submitted the journal to the AEC's
- 11 Division of Classification for review.
- 12 (6) Whereas Dr. Seaborg's journal was cleared by the
- 13 Division of Classification, virtually without deletion.
- 14 (7) Whereas twelve years later, in 1983, the chief his-
- 15 torian at the Department of Energy asked to borrow a
- 16 copy of Dr. Seaborg's journal in order to write a history
- 17 of the AEC.
- 18 (8) Whereas when the journal was returned to Dr.
- 19 Seaborg three years later, passage after passage was re-
- 20 dacted, including explicitly public information, such as the
- 21 published code names of nuclear weapons tests, and purely
- 22 personal material, such as his description of accompanying
- 23 his children on a "trick or treat" outing one Halloween
- 24 evening.

### 1 SEC. 2. DECLASSIFICATION OF SEABORG JOURNAL.

- 2 The Secretary of Energy shall return to Dr. Glenn
- 3 T. Seaborg his journal which the prepared while serving
- 4 as Chairman of he AEC. The journal shall be returned
- 5 in the original, unredacted form in which it was lent to
- 6 the Department of Energy in 1983.
